ORDER ON JOINT MOTION TO SEAL RECORDS

The Court, in chambers, considered the Joint Motion to Seal Records. Having reviewed the record, and being otherwise advised in the premises, the Court finds that the Joint Motion to Seal Records should be **GRANTED**.

1. The court find that the information or records of the court file should be sealed and the confidentiality of the information contained therein shall be maintained and protected from disclosure in order to avoid substantial injury to the parties.

2. The court finds that no less restrictive measures are available to protect the interest set forth in the preceding paragraph.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the motion to seal records in hereby granted.


IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of Court is hereby directed to seal the file and otherwise prevent the dissemination to the public of the information contained in the file. Except for the persons named in any subsequent order and in the conditions set forth in any such order the following are the only person to have access to and inspect the records in the file: a) the parties herein and their attorneys; b.) the clerk of the circuit court and employees thereof in fulfillment of their duties; c.) any person who establishes that disclosure of the information is

necessary for the government or judicial responsibility or has a first amendment right to the information.

The parties and their counsel are admonished that they are ordered likewise not to divulge any information to.
